

Fair access to basic health care is fundamental for thriving populations. Yet more than a third of the world population does not have access to equitable, quality healthcare. Health care professionals are needed with the right knowledge and tools improve the health care where it is most needed.

In the past 10 years, KIT Fund supported 67 public health professionals from low and middle-income countries to pursue a Master's at KIT. An Impact Report is conducted to measure the long-term impact and learn from alumni experiences.



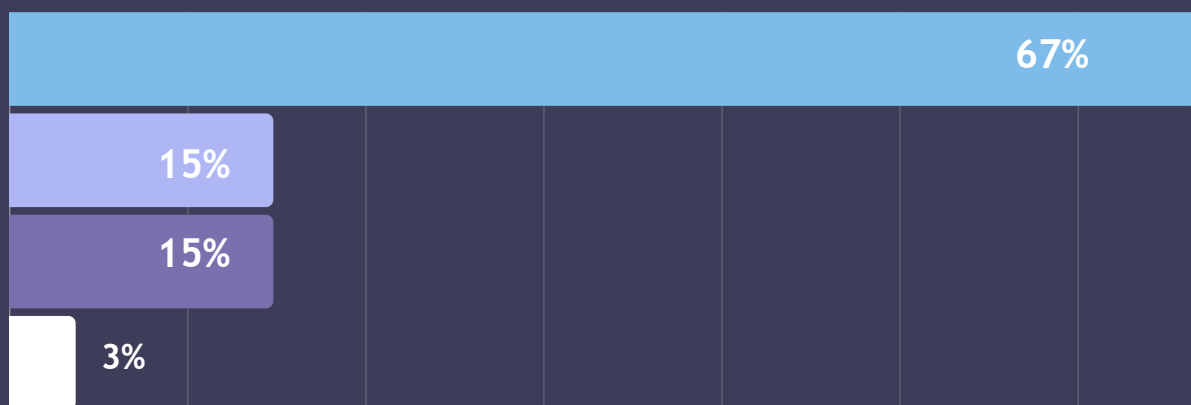
## RESPONSE RATE

## AFTER GRADUATION

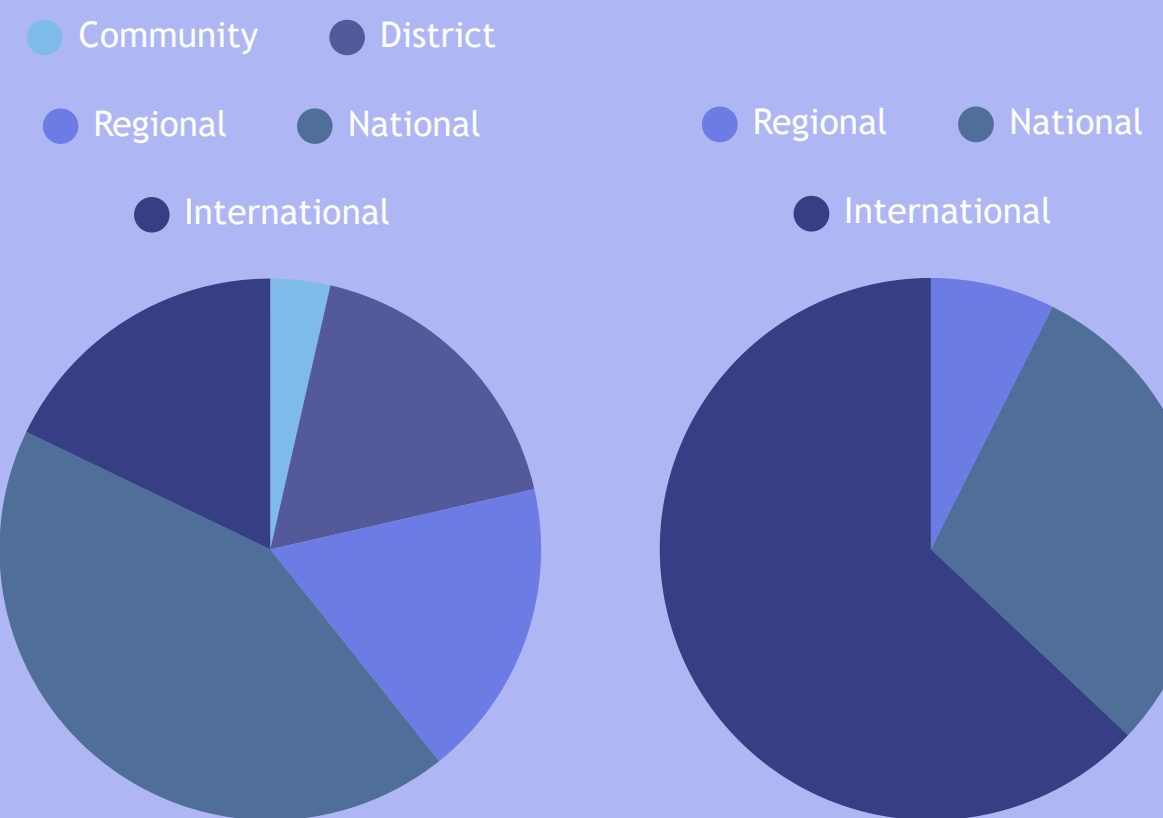
Alumni are:
